About the Professional Profile

Certified Asset Management Assessor (CAMA) applicants are required to complete a Professional Profile in their World Partners in Asset Management account. It is a mandatory component of all of WPiAM's Certifications.

The professional profile is used to demonstrate compliance with ISO 17021-5 Competence requirements for auditing and certification of asset management systems. This requires auditors to have experience in certain industry types and asset classes, and all of WPiAM's Certifications require candidates to demonstrate asset management work experience.

Certifications cannot be issued without a completed, approved Professional Profile.

Creating your profile

When you register for the CAMA Certification, regardless of whether you choose the Exam or Equivalency pathway, you will see the mandatory item called "Work Experience".

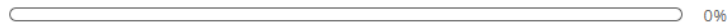

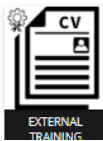

- Enter details here – enter the industry, asset classes and years of experience. For example: Agriculture – hoppers, tractors, grinders – 15 years.
- Attachment – upload your current CV/Resume. Your most recent CV (resume) must be uploaded in either PDF or word format.

Make sure you click “create” to save your profile to your CAMA Certification.
